Consider the following verb forms in Tz'utujil. (Note: x is pronounced [š] and 7 is pronounced [?].)

xinwari	'I slept'
neeli	'he/she leaves'
ne7eeli	'they leave'
nixwari	'you (pl) sleep'
xateeli	'you (sg) left'
natwari	'you (sg) sleep'
xoqeeli	'we left'
ninwari	'I sleep'
xixwari	ʻyou (pl) slept'
xe7eeli	'they left'
xwari	'he/she slept'
	neeli ne7eeli nixwari xateeli natwari xoqeeli ninwari xixwari xe7eeli

- (2) How would you say each of the following?
 - a. 'I left'
 - b. 'he/she sleeps'
 - c. 'we sleep'
