1. Consider the stress pattern for nouns in Lenakel. (Stress in verbs is more complicated, and we will not be considering it here.)

1.	nápuk	'lungs'
2.	tikómkom	'branches'
3.	tup ^w àlukáluk	'lungs'
4.	lètup ^w àlukáluk	'in the lungs'
5.	nèluyányaŋ	'twig'
6.	kayèlawélaw	'kind of dance'

Which settings for the parameters of stress assignment yield the correct stress for Lenakel nouns?

2. The following words exemplify the stress system of Latin. (The words are given in Latin orthography, with standard phonetic symbols for length and stress. *c*=/k/, *v*=/w/)

1.	amí:cus	'friend'
2.	agricolá:rum	'farmer (genitive plural)'
3.	vólucres	'winged (plural)'
4.	símula:	'snub nosed (feminine)'
5.	refé:cit	'set over' (3 singular perfect)
6.	agrícola	'farmer (nominative singular)'
7.	pepérci	'spare (1 singular perfect)'
8.	magíster	'master, teacher'
